Manuscripts should be DOUBLE SPACED in 12 point Times New Roman type, including abstract, text, quotations, endnotes (NO footnotes) using Arabic numerals, and bibliography. A bibliography of printed sources is required. In doubt as to format, consult a recent volume of the journal.

Manuscripts customarily do not exceed 45 pp

Authors can expect to wait 4-6 months for a decision on their submissions.

The journal does not accept unsolicited review essays or book reviews.

SUBMISSION OF ACCEPTED MANUSCRIPTS

The Editor will contact authors of accepted manuscripts with readers' reports requiring any alterations in content or style issues.

Please note that authors must clear permissions to publish illustrations on their own. (The journal doesn't do this.) Also, illustrations must be sent for publication in the form that meets the publication standards of the journal publisher. Authors should check with the Editor. Captions for illustrations should also be sent at the time of submission for publication.

After completing revisions, the author will send a final electronic file attachment, in Word, by the date agreed upon. Any delay in submission of copy or illustrations can result in delays in publication.
